EXCITING NEW OPPORTUNITIES IN EQUINE REPRODUCTION

While it has been almost 50 years since the first foal was conceived using frozen semen, and almost 40 years since the first foal was produced by embryo transfer, these reproductive techniques continue to be valuable assets to the equine breeder. Both of these procedures allow breeders to preserve and produce genetics that may not have been possible through routine breeding.

For many years, the utilization of frozen semen has allowed veterinarians and horse owners to produce foals from deceased stallions, stallions that have since been castrated, and show stallions that may not be available for collection during the breeding season. Additionally, frozen semen can act as The last couple of years have been exciting ones in equine reproduction with new research published on techniques and procedures that once were only applicable in a research setting.

an insurance policy for a stallion owner in the event the stallion becomes ill, infertile, or dies prematurely.

Embryo transfer has afforded mare owners the ability to produce foals from mares that are still showing or that are unable to maintain a pregnancy to term due to infertility, health problems or lameness. In some breed registries, such as the American Saddlebred Registry, owners are also allowed to register more than one foal per year from a mare. A filly born today may someday be bred to a stallion who died ten years ago and embryos may be frozen from a mare and those offspring not born until the mare is too old to produce any more foals.

Additionally, the last couple of years have been exciting ones in equine reproduction, with new research published on techniques and procedures that once were only applicable in a research setting. Intracytoplasmic sperm injection (ICSI), preimplantation genetic testing (which includes embryo sexing), and cryopreservation of day seven embryos are all now performed successfully. Through



the hard work of numerous researchers, these techniques are now available to horse owners commercially, providing new avenues to produce a foal.

On January 27, 2010, the world's first biopsied vitrified embryo foal was born at Minitube International Center for Biotechnology in Mt. Horeb, Wisconsin. The ability to biopsy equine embryos allows for cells to be collected from an embryo and submitted for testing for genetic traits (preimplantation genetic determination) such as gender (embryo sexing), coat color and genetic diseases. then transferred into a recipient once

Since 2010, several facilities in the United States have acquired the ability to provide these services to horse owners. The technology has also advanced so that the embryo, collected seven days after ovulation, may now be frozen until the genetic testing results are received. For the first time, horse owners can learn the sex, color or presence of genetic diseases of an embryo prior to transferring the embryo into a recipient mare. Prior to these advances, to achieve

acceptable pregnancy rates postfreezing, embryos destined for cryopreservation needed to be flushed from the donor mare on day six, resulting in decreased embryo recovery rates. Now, a mare can be brought to a facility, such as Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital's Reproduction Center in Lexington, Kentucky, and an embryo flush can be performed. The embryo is then shipped to one of the several facilities providing embryo sexing and preimplanta-

ICSI has also become more widely available commercially and affords mare owners the ability to obtain foals from mares that have not been able to produce embryos or pregnancies successfully. Eggs can be collected from the donor mare, fertilized with a single sperm, incubated, and transferred into a recipient mare. For some mares this becomes the only option for producing a foal.

Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital's state of the art Reproduction Center provides services from

routine breeding management with cooled or frozen semen to the diagnosis, treatment and management of problem mares. Facilities like Rood & Riddle provide stallion services too, such as phantom training, semen collection and evaluation, processing of semen for cooled shipment and freezing, and diagnosis and treatment of stallions with fertility problems. Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital also

maintains an onsite recipient herd for embryo transfers.

Primarily showing at the major west coast shows, his record of Stake wins was numerous, with horses like Blythe Fairy, Mr. Executive, Glee Ring, Mr. Poppin, Why Worry Coralita, Knight Shade, Sea Secret, Northern Tradition, Spirit Time, Tippin In, Mark Of Merit, Vanity's Bell, Northern Event, and Burning Tree's Brandywine.

Hope was a recognized judge with the American Horse Shows Association, judging some of the major shows nationwide, and a member of the United Professional Horsemen's Association and the American Saddlebred Horse Association. After an early retirement, Hope trained hunting field trial dogs, winning national championships.

He became an accomplished saddle and harness maker, and collected and restored antique horse drawn vehicles. His love to see the high country motivated him to raise Tennessee Walking Horse Mules and ride the upper Cascade Range with his wife and friends. Hope took a wagon and his team of Suffolk-pains or driving mules on many wagon trains. He and his wife, Patricia, also traveled with their dogs in their motor home.

Dal Hope is survived by his brothers and sisters, and his wife of 55 years, Patricia.

Frank S. Vignieri

Frank S. Vignieri, age 73, of Kenosha, Wisconsin, died on December 25, 2011, at his home in Kenosha. In 1976 he continued his career at Wisconsin Packing Company (Emmpak Foods) of Butler, Wisconsin where he spent 27 years and retired in 2003 as Senior Vice President. He was highly regarded throughout the industry with a reputation for building enduring relationships and innovating high quality products.

Frank was also a business partner with his wife, Kathy, in the breeding and showing of American Saddlebred and National Show Horses. In 1970, Frank and Kathy opened their own barn, Bridle Vale Stables. They bought Irish Bourbon, one of the last breeding stallions by Genius Bourbon King and put him under the management of Jan Hoffman. Then they also selected two broodmares from Jim B. Robertson. These mares, Joyful and Mardi Gras Co-Ed, were the foundation mares for many of their show horses to come. At the same time their daughters, Eva and Jenifer, eight and seven respectively, started riding and showing under the direction of their trainers, Geri Schwartzberg Robertson and Dan Evenson. Also at that time, Kathy showed the fine harness horse, Supreme Creation, full brother to ^{CH}Supreme Airs (BHF).

In 1976 they closed their barn and the girls continued their equitation career under Dawn Atlas. Later, and through the years, their family and young horses were associated with Royal Scot Stables under Bonnie Byrne and later at Bonnie's own stable, Stoney Hill Farm with Dave Patton and Steve Joyce, and later at Oakwood Farm with Dave, and VIP Stables with Carl Irwin. Some of the horses raised and shown during these years were Denmark's April Joy, Yes Yes Indeed, Choice's Gypsy Rose, and Work of Art.

More recently their successful breeding stock, such as Vinnie Valone and Vanna Valone, has been trained by their son-in-law Dan Barker at his stable in Waterford, Wisconsin. Dan also trained and showed the very successful National Show Horse, Vito Valone, to many Regional and National Championships.

In 2011, the season was culminated by winning the High Point award of the Mid-America Horse Show Association in the Junior Fine Harness Division with Fire By the Bay who is trained at the Terri Anne Ullman Stables by Jimmy Orphonos.

Frank is survived by his wife Katherine; his three children, Frank N. (Lisa) Vignieri, Eva (Chris) Laurenzi, and Jenifer (Dan) Barker; and his three grand children, Amelia and Amber Vignieri, and Elizabeth Laurenzi. In his memory, the Frank S. Vignieri Memorial Fund for Stem Cell Research for Regeneration of Cardiac Muscle has been established at the University of Wisconsin. 2012 BROODMARE HALL OF FAME

In 2012, five mares, Yorktown's Forget-Me-Not, Magic Town, My Bugatti Royale, HMS My Fair Lady, and ^{CH}Garland's Dream gained entry into the elusive Broodmare Hall of Fame (BHF). For the first time, all five mares have sires tracing directly to six-time Five-Gaited World's Grand Champion (WGC) ^{CH}Wing Commander through his son and three-time Five-Gaited WGC, ^{CH}Yorktown. Two are daughters of ^{CH}Yorktown, two are granddaughters, and one is a great granddaughter.

With the addition of these two daughters, ^{CH}Yorktown moves up on the list of Top Sires of Hall of Fame broodmares. He now has a total of five BHF daughters and is tied with American Ace. When ranked by percentage of number of BHF mares to number of foals sired, he ranks third behind WGC sires Stonewall Supreme and Anacacho Denmark, and ahead of World's Champion ^{CH}King's Genius.

The ranking of the top sires of Hall of Fame broodmares follows — giving breeders a chance to see which stallion lines have consistently sired mares that produce the required number of world's and reserve world's champion offspring needed for entry into the Broodmare Hall of Fame.

BHF Eligibility Requirements

A mare must have produced a minimum of three offspring that have earned a combination of the following titles at the Kentucky State Fair World's Championship Horse Show: three World's Champions; or two World's Champions and one Reserve World's Champion; or one World's Champion and two Reserve World's Champions. In any combination, the mare must have produced three different offspring, each of which must have won one of these titles. The titles are restricted to specific classes, with a minimum of entries, in the five-gaited, three-gaited and fine harness divisions.

In addition, one of the following may replace one World's Champion or one Reserve World's Champion requirement: the mare produced one sire of five World's Champions, or the mare produced one producer (dam) of a World's Champion. The World's Champion-producing son or daughter cannot be the same horse whose win is counted toward Broodmare Hall of Fame status. More information on the Broodmare Hall of Fame program can be found in the 2012 American Saddlebred Reference Directory.

Bred by Paul Hamilton of Springfield, Kentucky, ^{CH}Garland's Dream is the second daughter of WC sire WC Harlem Globetrotter to enter the Broodmare Hall of Fame. Harlem

Globetrotter has sired over 30 different WC winners and is the broodmare sire of 37 producers of Kentucky State Fair (KSF) first or second place winners. His sire, New Yorker, has three daughters in the Broodmare Hall of Fame, grandsire ^{CH}Yorktown has

five, and great grandsire ^{CH}Wing Commander has six, tied with his sire ^{CH}Anacacho Shamrock. Along with WGC five-gaited horses on his top side, Harlem Globetrotter's pedigree also features Fine Harness WGC Supreme Airs on his bottom side.

^{CH}Garland's Dream is the only foal of her dam Rose Garland GTR, the 1983 WC Three-Year-Old Five-Gaited Mare. Her second dam, Portrait In Blue is also the dam of (SA) Quakertown (by CHYorktown) that was exported to South Africa and features in the pedigrees of imported sires (SA) Molligny Don't Worry Be Happy and (SA) Dellview Dare Time. Her fourth dam is



Miss Pridget, dam of top show horses ^{CH}Mountjoy's American Aristocrat and Coe's Royal Echo, and her fifth dam is Hall of Fame broodmare Mary's Heart. Rose Garland GTR is sired by Longview's Supreme (^{CH}Valley View Supreme x A Sheer Delight by King

Coe), sire of WC ^{CH}Chat, WC ^{CH}Elation GTR and WC ^{CH}Belle Supreme GTR (BHF), etc.

Following in the footsteps of her WC winning parents, ^{CH}Garland's Dream began her show career winning the 1994 National Three-Year-Old Five-Gaited Futurity. Purchased by Lynn and Peter Via's Fox Grape Farms, she would go on to win a world title in the KSF Five-Gaited Junior Mare Stake, four world titles in the KSF

CHGARLAND'S DREAM (BHF) . CONTINUED

Five-Gaited Mare Stake and was twice crowned Five-Gaited WGC. There are 18 different Hall of Fame broodmares in ^{CH}Garland's Dream's five-generation pedigree, along with three Five-Gaited WGCs, two Fine Harness WGCs and one Three-Gaited WGC. Her five-generation pedigree is extremely well balanced with WGC's in all three divisions, the "golden cross" and added gameness from both Stonewall Supreme and King Coe. While competing in the show ring, ^{CH}Garland's Dream had her first two foals via embryo transplant. Her last show ring appearance was in 2000.

In 2010, her sixth foal, Fox Grape's Imprimis (by WC sire Undulata's Nutcracker), became the first of her foals to win a world title when he won RWC in the National Three-Year-Old Three-Gaited Futurity. In 2011, Undulata's Dream Team, embryo transplant full brother to Fox Grape's Imprimis and born just one day after him, became the World's Champion Junior Three-Gaited Over-Two. Undulata's Dream Team had previously won a world's championship in the Kentucky Futurity Open Weanling class, but wins in in-hand classes don't count towards inclusion in the BHF. Once again a winning futurity foal went on to win in the performance division.

Magic Town's very first foal, CHJac Lu Mar's Mountain Contract (by Handley's Contract), was the 1983 Reserve World's Champion Five-Gaited Two-Year-Old. Her second foal, CHSantana's Sage (by Sultan's Santana) was the 1984 WC Five-Gaited Two-Year-Old. Sage, as game and gutsy as his breeding suggests, went on to win another reserve world's championship title and was 1988 WC Five-Gaited Ladies Gelding. However, the elusive third WC or RWC winning offspring remained out of reach for Magic Town for another 24 years.

Diamond Lou, a full sister to CHSantana Sage, was foaled in 1984. Her biggest show ring victory came in 1991 when she won a novice five-gaited class at Rock Creek. Retired to the broodmare ranks she produced several foals with show records. Her sixth foal, Most Definitely Diamonds (by Attache's Royal Assets) won the 2011 Five-Gaited Ladies Amateur Mare World's Champion. With this win, Magic Town now had one world's champion son, one reserve world's champion son and a daughter who produced a world's champion, enough to earn her a place in the Broodmare Hall of Fame. With five-gaited winners galore and multiple traces to Five-Gaited WGC Bourbon King it is easy to see why all of her

qualifying offspring are five-gaited. Her papers show the major Rex Peavine son, King Vine, on both the top and bottom. She also has 10 different Hall

of Fame Broodmares in her pedigree.

Bred by the A.G. McNeese, Jr. Estate of Houston, Texas, My Bugatti Royale is by the colorfully-marked RWC Fine Harness Stallion/Gelding Local Hero. Her dam is the beautiful black Bi-Mi Replique, winner of the ASR Kentucky Futurity Yearling Open class. Local Hero is a product of the famed CHYorktown x Denmark's Bourbon Genius cross. He is by CHYorktown and out of Barham's Reality (BHF), making him a full brother to twice WGC Three-Gaited CHHome Town Hero and to Hometown Belle (dam of both the many-time Ladies and Amateur Fine Harness WC CHThe Homecoming Queen and multiple five-gaited WC CHThe Homecoming Hero). He also traces to tough-as-nails Stonewall King through his dam.

Bi-Mi Replique is by a son of Night Of Folly (by Society Rex) and out of a Vanity's Sensation mare, giving her both gameness and exquisite beauty, which she passed to her offspring as seen in My Bugatti Royale's half-sister, 1991 Three-Gaited 15.2 & Under WC and RWGC Mini Griggs. Kalarama Rex appears twice in the fifth generation of her dam side. When shown under her original name, Tituba SC, My Bugatti Royale was the 1994 RWC Fine Harness Two-Year-Old Mare. She was the first RWC sired by Local Hero, and she is his first BHF daughter. She went on to win the 1996 WC Junior Fine Harness Stake, Fine Harness WGC Bourbon Genius appears in her five-generation pedigree twice, and her dam traces to multiple Fine Harness WGC CHMeadow Vanity. With relatives like that, it's no wonder she was a fine harness WC herself.

Entering the broodmare ranks in 1998, My Bugatti Royale produced just 7 foals. Her first foal is current breeding stallion Jon Bugatti (sire of WC Kent Brockman) and her second foal is the winning three-gaited Charm's Royale. It was her 2001 foal by WC sire WC Santana's Charm, that gave My Bugatti Royale her first BHF qualification. CHOur

Charming Lady was not only the 2007, 2008 and 2010 WC Ladies Three-Gaited, but also the 2009 Three-Gaited WGC. A repeat breeding of My Bugatti Royale to Santana's Charm produced full brother, I'm Royalty Too, the 2008 Five-Gaited Ladies Stake, Division I WC, earning My Bugatti Royale her second qualification. The CHYorktown x Sultan's Santana cross (a version of the modern day "golden cross" of CHWing Commander x CHValley View Supreme) had proven to be a good one, so the breeding was repeated again, resulting in the last foal on record for My Bugatti Royale. That colt, stallion son My Royale Charm, (full brother to Our Charming Lady and I'm Royalty Too) was RWC Five-Gaited Junior Stallion/Gelding Division II in 2011. Bridget Mills Parker of Versailles, Kentucky is the last owner on record of My Bugatti Royale.

The most prolific of our 2012 BHF inductees, Yorktown's Forget-Me-Not produced 19 foals. Bred by Terry Livingston of St. Paul, Virginia, Forget-Me-Not was purchased by Larry Hartsock of Castlewood, Virginia with her fourth foal by her side. The colt,

^{CH}Walterway's Remember Me, was sired by Hartsock's own breeding stallion Star Material (Talent Town x Gold Star's Ballerina by Stonewall's Main Event). *Remember Me* won his first world's championship in the 1999 Kentucky Amateur Weanling Futurity. In-hand

wins do not count toward BHF status, but *Remember Me* proved that top futurity foals can make top performance horses. He won not one but nine world's championship titles in the ladies five-gaited division, giving his dam her first BHF qualification many times over.

Forget-Me-Not is a daughter of C^HYorktown and some might have questioned the mating of a ^{CH}Yorktown mare to Talent Town (^{CH}Yorktown x Chantilly Rose by Denmark's Bourbon Genius). Call it line breeding or inbreeding, either way it worked. Hartsock continued to repeat the same successful breeding, resulting in 10 more full siblings to *Remember Me*. In 2009, full brother Walterway's Pardon Me bested a class of 19 to be crowned World's Champion (WC) Junior Five-

> Gaited Stallion/Gelding, giving his dam her second qualification for BHF. In 2011 a full sister, Walterway's What About Me — was reserve in the Five-Gaited Mare Stake, earning the final qualification needed to elevate her dam to BHF status.

Forget-Me-Not features five different Five-Gaited WGCs in her five-

generation pedigree, so it comes as no surprise that all her BHF qualifying offspring are five-gaited. Her dam, Pretty Pretty, is by WC sire Anacacho Empire, son of Anacacho Denmark (broodmare sire of ^{CH}Yorktown) and is out of Golden Dawn's Genius (BHF). Nine other Hall of Fame broodmares appear on her top line. In the fourth and fifth generations of her pedigree we find both Five-Gaited WGC Edna May's King and his sire Five-Gaited WGC Bourbon King

numerous times. Anacacho Denmark, paternal half-brother to ^{CH}Anacacho Shamrock appears on her dam side.

Though she had no show record of her own, Yorktown's Forget-Me-Not inherited the gene for five-gaited powerhouses and passed it to her offspring. With the exception of one daughter kept back as a broodmare, each of her 11 foals by Star Material has a show record, most in the five-gaited division. Her broodmare daughter, Walterway's Especially Me, is already the dam of Walterway's Sam-Me, 2011 Lexington Junior League UPHA Three-Year-Old Five-Gaited winner. *Forget-Me-Not* is still owned by Larry Hartsock and her last foal was registered in 2007.

There you have it — five additions to the Broodmare Hall of Fame. Three were unshown, one was a world's champion in fine harness, and one was a two-time Five-Gaited WGC. One had 19 foals, one only 7. Some had winning offspring that qualified them quickly; one mare took 24 years to reach BHF status. Some had qualifying offspring that were full siblings; others had offspring by several different stallions. Two have the modern-day "golden cross" of CHWing Commander x Valley View Supreme, two doubled up on ^{CH}Anacacho Shamrock through his paternal brother Anacacho Denmark on their dam side, and one brought in a double dose of Kalarama Rex on her bottom side. All unique, yet each mare traces directly through her sire line to ^{CH}Wing Commander through his son ^{CH}Yorktown. Coincidence? Possibly. Next year's crop of Broodmare Hall of Fame mares may go another direction entirely, but if you have a broodmare bred like any of the mares above, you might want to hang onto her.

They also mirrored some of Jackie Hale's advice on how important social media is in promoting, celebrating, and connecting your riding program.

Saturday morning's round table discussions included Everything You Want to Know about Bits, An Athlete is an Athlete: Marketing Saddlebreds to the Sport Horse Community, and Smart Breeding: Knowledge for Your Bottom Line.

Nelson Green, Jim and Fay Lowry, and Todd Miles discussed bits with a studious crowd. Each person chose their most treasured bits from their

storied tack rooms to share and describe their benefits, and which types of horses they work best on. Jim Lowry discussed which snaffle bits are best to start colts out with, Nelson Green shared his knowledge on curb bits, Todd Miles explained to the crowd how he prepares his horses' mouths for their amateur and juvenile mounts, and Fay Lowry shared which bits are best for western and hunter horses.

Julie Lynn Andrew and Paula Briney discussed dressage, Kathie Dunn shared her knowledge of Western Dressage, Carol Jones and Tom Thorpe shared their secrets to success with Hunter and Western Pleasure horses, Darryl Leifheit and Sterling Graburn took the crowd to the world of combined driving, and Lisa Siderman

described why Saddlebreds are great distance riding horses. Each expert's discussion was accompanied by a photo-heavy PowerPoint that

really helped the crowd to visualize what they were learning.

Saddlebreds for All Ages

The Charter Club Council Saddlebred for All Ages committee presentation at the ASHA Convention hit on points highlighting show and charter club activities which would help promote the American Saddlebred to the mainstream equine industry.

Committee Chair Ricky Drew gave the presentation on behalf of the committee. Some of the highlights of the program included the following:

Shows

Make sure all shows are holding lead line and walk-trot/jog (beginner) classes. Encourage shows to offer walk-trot/jog in three age divisions: 10 Years and Under; 11-17 Years; Adult. If possible (if entries will support it), break into disciplines of Saddle Seat, Western and Hunt.

Encourage shows to hold Masters Classes in all Saddlebred divisions (Masters being riders 50 years of age and older).

Charter Clubs

Encourage clubs to offer year-end awards for Lead-liners and Walk-Trotters, both on Saddlebreds and other breed horses (two separate divisions). Reasoning: get junior riders involved in a Saddlebred club and when they are looking for a canter/lope horse, they won't want to leave the club, thus they look for a Saddlebred.

Encourage clubs to offer yearend awards for Masters Division. Offer the year-end award by point total in two categories: all Saddlebred breed classes; riding a Saddlebred in open classes. Reasoning: in some regions there are not enough Masters on Saddlebreds to put classes into shows yet, but by adding these two year-end awards it will create more interest in Saddlebred clubs.

Encourage clubs to offer yearend awards in Trail Riding: Based on mileage and age division. We suggest breaking it into Juniors (under 18), Adults and Masters. Offer certificates at certain mileage, plaques at milestone mileages, and trophies for high miles in each age category.

Encourage clubs to offer year-end awards where a horse is nominated for non-traditional categories. Offer awards competing outside the traditional show ring and trail rides. This includes dressage, eventing, jumping and competitive driving. These awards are not based on points. The horse is to be nominated by any member and presented to the board of directors one month before the banquet to be considered. The board may award any number of these awards based on the nominations.

Other Promotions

Encourage clubs and stables to do a free introductory lesson program. At Equine Affaire in Massachusetts three years ago, the ASHA booth introduced such a program in which 18 stables in New England were involved. Anyone who has not ridden a Saddlebred is encouraged to sign up, and we then match them up with the stable closest to them for a free introductory lesson. We post the stables info at the booth so they get some publicity also, and we do a flyer listing all of the New England Saddlebred barns. We feel if we can help get the rider into a Saddlebred facility, then the trainer/instructor has a shot at keeping them as a client, and eventually they will own Saddlebreds. (We also suggest a school program similar to this that the stables use with local schools.)

Petting Stalls: If you are running any public event such as a booth at Equine Affaire, use a petting stall. This shows the public the friendliness of the American Saddlebred, and works very well with children becoming interested.

Demonstrations: If you are conducting a demonstration while promoting the Saddlebred, try to involve every aspect possible. Get everything/everyone involved in the demo, from lead line to fivegaited, and EVERYTHING and EVERYONE in between, including driving. Show all ages and aspects of the American Saddlebred! If you have time, even include a jump or two for hunter, and an obstacle or two for trail horses.

The Saddlebred for All Ages presentation was well-rounded, and should help create many more ideas for shows and charter clubs to help grow their attendance and membership.

Summary of Committee Meetings

Association, Registry, and joint committees are advisory in nature. Therefore, "decisions" made at the committee level are forwarded to a respective board of directors for further consideration and final approval or revision.

Breeders Committee

The committee gave a brief review of business that was discussed in 2011. Mr. Crabtree reported on the recommendations that were previously submitted by the committee for Breeder of the Year and Breeders Hall of Fame.

Ms. Gatlin reported on the subcommittee that was established to review and make changes to ASHA Reference Directory. It was stated that while some information was eliminated from the directory, it had been posted on the ASHA website. These changes resulted in a substantial cost savings.

Ms. Musselman raised new business regarding forum and choice of law clauses that should be considered for all stallion breeding and/ or embryo contracts. Such clauses would allow for any legal action to be held in the home county/state of the party that is being sued.

Equine Welfare Committee

One grant recommendation was sent in 2011 to the ASHA board and approved. New Business: Looking for new ways to reach out to those in need through Charter Clubs and UPHA Chapters. It was also discussed about possibly offering free membership to ASHA Charter Clubs for those who have adopted Saddlebreds from "recognized" rescue groups. Mark and Neila McCracken offered to put together a "how to" book for a smallscale breeder to know how to best do a dispersal and what the pitfalls are. Saddlebred Rescue will offer to help put this together as there are reliable sources available. This would be an ASHA publication.

Grand National Committee

Mr. Crabtree reported on the statistics and history of the Grand National program. The status of the restructure proposal that the committee had been working on for the last year with a consultant was also discussed.

Kentucky and National Futurities Committee

Mr. Lilly reported on previous business that the committee had discussed which included the addition of a rule for mares producing twins, addition of a USEF rule for the National Three-Year-Old Futurity Park class, weanling payment/foal registration deadlines and the division of classes for the Two and Three-Year-Old Futurity Fine Harness classes.

Ms. Edwards addressed the committee regarding the possibility of combining the weanling payment and mare nominations due to the similarity of due dates for weanling payments, foal registration for weanlings showing and Kentucky State Fair's entry closing date. The committee felt this may discourage breeders from nominating their mares. The committee agreed the grace period deadline for weanling payments and foal registration deadline should be the same as the Kentucky State Fair first entry closing date.

Pleasure Disciplines Committee

Mr. Matton explained that we have received a request to add a Juvenile Five-Gaited Pleasure Division to the State Pleasure Horse Awards. After discussion, Ms. Crumpler moved that we recommend to the Board that a Juvenile Five-Gaited Pleasure Division be added to the State Pleasure Horse Awards. The committee also asked that we make sure we have awards categories for Country Pleasure 17 and under and for Country Pleasure 18 and over.

Ms. Bradshaw asked the committee to consider adding a Saddlebred Pleasure - Walk-Jog class to the rules. Discussion took place regarding the draft class specifications she provided. After consideration, Ms. Thompson made a motion to recommend to the Association Board that class specifications for Walk-Jog Western Pleasure be added to the USEF rules for a Walk-Jog Western Pleasure class, Ms. Boone seconded and the motion was passed with all in favor.

Mr. Matton explained the background on the change in the rules and the point system for the Saddlebred Record Program for the Country Pleasure Division which was implemented effective December 1, 2008. Ms. Todd is requesting that this system be implemented retroactively back to the start of the program. There are a number of deceased horses that might have been eligible for Saddlebred Record under this system. After discussion, it was suggested that we ask the Registry Board to considered allowing owners to request that points be calculated under the system in place prior to December 1, 2008 for an additional fee of \$100 or so. The committee agreed to table this matter for now.

Mr. Matton reported that the National Championship Pleasure Equitation Class has been awarded to the Wisconsin Futurity; however, the management is willing to give it up. He is requesting approval to move this class to St. Louis. Another judge would be added to the show. After discussion, Ms. Thompson made a motion to ask the Board to move the class to St. Louis, Mr. Thorpe seconded and the motion passed with all in favor.

Sport Horse Committee

Ms. Frank explained the history of the Sport Horse Incentive Program which is somewhat based on the Young Jumper Program. It is designed to reward enrolled horses based on the number of points earned in a show year which is December 1 - November 30. Some committee members participated in the program in 2011 and talked about their experiences. 17 horses were enrolled in 2011. It was agreed that we need to market the program to new owners.

Ms. Thompson talked about a project that the committee is working on to help breeders and owners to be able to properly identify what discipline a horse might be suited to. We have been asking willing professionals to complete a form and submit it to the office so that we can develop a list of professionals by state and by discipline. The list includes contact information. The concept is that you can contact a professional in your area and they can tell you what discipline your horse might be suited for and also tell you what level the horses might be able to go to.

Ms. Frank provided some information on marketing to the Jumper Community, including some articles on striving for success in show jumping and shopping for a jumper prospect.

The committee talked about a desire to have a section of the website devoted to Sport Horses that could be interactive. Committee members could respond to questions submitted. A discussion took place regarding marketing Saddlebreds. One idea was to have t-shirts identifying your horse as being a Saddlebred and listing the website address. They also discussed sending blogs out on various Sport Horse topics.

Ms. Thompson explained the format of the Round Table on Marketing to the Sport Horse

Growing up in Columbia, Missouri, Dick Boettcher attended the 'Farmer's Fair' at the University of Missouri. It was there that he saw a walk-trot pony that caught his eye named General Ike. From then on he was hooked on horses.

During his high school years he started working for Bob and Anne Boettcher at their stable at the Boone County Fairgrounds. He lived and worked with the Boettchers, and this led to them adopting him. They then moved to Minnesota, where Dick finished high school and went on to college. He then spent two years at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Minnesota where he studied pre-law. He soon realized that his love of horses was stronger than his love of law, and he returned to working with horses full time. During his years in Minnesota, the Boettchers' top horses included Stonewall's Beau Peavine, Intoxication and Royal Jester.

Feeling the need to get work experience with other trainers, he got a job with Fritz Jordan at Hayfield Farm in Kentucky where he worked for about three years. Shortly thereafter, Dick decided to open his first public training stable in Bellefontaine, Ohio. He later noted, "I found out I didn't know as much about the most important part of the horse business — dealing with customers!"

After making a go of it, Dick opted for more experience with other horsemen. First he went to work with Ellis Waggoner at Brownview Farm in Murfreesboro, Tennessee. There he met Bob Lewis. They talked and Lewis hired him over the phone to work at Silver Lining Stables, then in Rancho Santa Fe, California. While he was Lewis' assistant trainer there, Dick noted their stable's strength, "We were very dominant, so much so that other barns were intimidated. One year at Santa Barbara, we won every Saddlebred class except for one second."

After his stay at Silver Lining Stables, Dick went onto being hired by Mrs. William Roth's Why Worry Farm. From there it was a move up the coast to the Menlo Circus Club, at that time the home of Brigadoon Stable. It was a short stay, and then he moved to Kentucky. He spent time working with Bob Whitney before moving back to Minnesota to work for Paul Preibe. Although he grew up in Minnesota, he said, "I got tired of working horses with their saliva freezing to the bits!"

So he moved a little south to work for Dr. Alan Raun at Reedannland. Dick has said of Doc Raun, "In my estimation, he is one of the finest gentlemen who has ever been in the horse business." Dick worked for Doc Raun for nearly a year, when he got a call from Betty Miller, owner of Silver Lining Stables. They had moved near Danville, Kentucky, and Doc Raun advised him to take the job. Dick was there for 12 years.

Working at Silver Lining meant being involved in every aspect of the horse business. There were times when there were four stallions and 30 broodmares. Their show string performed at a high level for decades. Horses such as Oh, Lady Be Good: Dutchman's Gold and CHChalton's Half Angel joined the list of stars that included CHYou Arc Love before the move from California. Half Angel was also versatile. Dick showed Half Angel to victories in the Kentucky County Fair Championships at Louisville, winning in each division in three consecutive years. In 1976 it was the Five-Gaited division, followed by the Three-Gaited, and then the Fine Harness.

In 1979, another opportunity came his way, when Ed Bennett introduced Dick to Darlene Miller and he moved to Sunny View Farm, where he was until July of 1980. Dick said, "I had fallen in love with the Northwest and decided this is where I wanted to spend the rest of my life... I took a gamble and went into public training in the Seattle area. My first barn was in Kirkland and my first customer, Misha Leendertsen, is still with me."

Of course he is rightly proud of the horses he started and developed. Some of the top horses are ^{CH}Doubletrees Steel The Show, ^{CH}Rejoice, Dutchman's Gold, SLS Sportin' Life, and Very Good Eddie. Of the Northwest, Dick has said, "Being here in the Northwest afforded me the opportunity to have some of the best horses of my career... some of the best in the country! Linda and Olen Wilford gave me the opportunity to have ^{CH}Be Happy. Other great ones are Popeye and Harley Hey."

Dick is proud of the way the Saddlebred business has grown in the Northwest over the last 25 years. Lately he's enjoyed judging, and after all it has all come back to the horses. Dick explains, "I love my horses and am grateful everything is because of the horses."

The Standards and Rules Committee of the ASHA invites the particular consideration and attention of all competitors, officials, and managements to the following United States Equestrian Federation rules (paraphrased). Please publicize and post this bulletin in an appropriate public area. We thank you for your cooperation.

USEF Rule Reference Description

GR 410.1	No horse and/or pony competing in a Breed or Discipline designated as (or part of) a Therapeutic Substance Group is to be shown in any class at a competition licensed by the Federation (see also GR402.1, last sentence) if it has been administered in any manner or otherwise contains in its tissues, body fluids or excreta a forbidden substance except as provided in GR411 For purposes of this rule, a forbidden substance includes: f. Any anabolic steroid.			
GR 801.4	Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) and/or a protective safety vest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge.			
GR 839	Cruelty to or the abuse of a horse by any person at a Licensed Competition is forbidden, constitutes a violation under Chapter 7, and renders the offender subject to penalty. The following acts are included under the words Cruelty and Abuse but are not limited thereto: Use of shackles, hock hobbles and similar devices (not to be construed as rubber or elastic exercising devices).			
GR 839.4m.	The following acts are included under the words Cruelty and Abuse but are not limited thereto: m. Use of any object that prevents the horse's ability to close his mouth. (Exception: use of an oral speculum by a veterinarian or equine dentist to provide legitimate dental/oral medical care.)

Attention getting devices &/or other noisemakers (including but not limited to tape measures blow horns, altered bamboo poles, explosives, etc.) are not allowed in and around the make up/schooling/warm-up and competition rings during scheduled competition sessions. Use of explosives and fire extinguishers by or for exhibitors/competitors (except in the case of fire) is not allowed on competition grounds at any time.			
SB 102.2/105	Horses with extremely low backs must be severely penalized in all stripped performance classes, harness classes, and in-hand classes.			
SB 103.3	Horses may be shown with unset tails in any class without penalty.			
SB 103.4	All horses shall be worked both ways of the ring at all required gaits as directed by the judge(s). Workouts will be judged as a separate class, and horses must be tied for placings All horses chosen for a workout must be worked both ways of the ring at any or all gaits listed in the class specifications An exhibitor is entitled to request only one five minute time out per class including workout. (See SB 103.4 & GR 833)			
SB 103.5-6	A judge must order from the ring any unruly horse or one whose actions threaten to endanger the rider, driver, handler, other exhibitors or their entries. A judge must order from the ring any rider, driver, or handler who exhibits inappropriate or dangerous behavior or whose actions would in any way threaten the safety of any exhibitor, their entries or the safety of class officials.			

SB 105 In a stripped class, when manners are paramount (i.e. Ladies, Junior Exhibitors, Amateurs, and Owners), riders must remount and return to the line up before the judges will be allowed to turn in their cards.
