Favoritism among the adherents of the breed, or promoting one individual (horse or member) at the expense of others, will be avoided. *American Saddlebred* strives to publish content that benefits the membership as a whole, and to that end, memberships are required of individuals or their family members who are featured in editorial content. Every effort is made to balance current and historical topics in *American Saddlebred*. Promoting a positive image of the American Saddlebred requires prohibiting the use of photographs of horses that are wearing any artificial training devices, i.e., chains, shackles, etc., in the pages of *American Saddlebred*, whether in editorial or advertising content.

Cover photographs will not feature recognizable living horses, which might be considered a show of favoritism or promotion of one individual over others, except as specifically approved by the ASHA Board of Directors.

Advertising Policy—Revised July 2004: Advertisements submitted to the *American Saddlebred* magazine MUST comply with these guidelines or they will be respectfully returned.

1. Each must contain the horse's full registered name and registration number.

2. Each must contain the sex and date of each horse advertised.

3. Only original *American Saddlebred* may be advertised.

4. For historical purposes, altered images (whether digitally or otherwise) that have changed the position, conformation or way of going of the horse will be refused.

Marketing and Promotion

I am delighted to report on several exciting promotional initiatives that are underway, thanks to our ASHA Marketing Committee led by Chair Jeff Hagerman. ASHA is now a proud occupant of a stall in the new Kids Barn at the Kentucky Horse Park, which was the former Draft Horse Barn which has recently been transformed into a fun and educational stop designed to engage school-age children in discovering the wonder of horses. Each stall in the Kids Barn features different interactive exhibits, ranging from veterinarian and general equine information and nutrition to different competitive disciplines.

The Kids Barn also features live horse demonstrations, giving children a chance to touch and even help groom horses, and incorporates a variety of activities such as a scavenger hunt throughout the Park which starts at the Kids Barn. The ASHA's presence in the Kids Barn gives us the opportunity to introduce the thousands of Horse Park visitors to *The Horse America Made*, and to encourage Horse Park visitors to visit the Saddlebred Museum just a short walk away.

As part of our continuing outreach efforts, we've befriended an American Saddlebred horse who is on loan to the Kentucky Horse Park's Parade of Breeds program, *CSF Memories Silk* (owned by Linda Legg of Charleston, West Virginia); "Silk" is a friendly five-gaited gelding who thrives on attention and is a perfect ambassador for our breed!

Silk was featured at the Celebration of Hope breast cancer survivors' luncheon hosted by Kentucky's First Lady Jane Beshear during Kentucky Derby week in the Alltech Arena at the Kentucky Horse Park. This event included an "equine fashion show," with ten different breeds of horses being led down an equine cat-

walk; Silk was the event's grand finale, and he was the only horse who appeared under saddle, capably ridden at the trot and rack by ASHA employee Michelle Krentz, as he delighted the Governor and Mrs. Beshear and hundreds of other distinguished guests in attendance.

We're honored to participate in the upcoming BreyerFest event to be held at the Kentucky Horse Park the weekend after the Lexington Junior League Horse Show, July 20-22. *CSF Sprinkles*, the ASHA 2010 Horse of the Year, now has a Breyer Model made after her, and this wonderful mare will be at the 2012 BreyerFest live and in person, to meet her fans and sign autographs.

Thanks to the generosity of the Rainbolt-Forbes family and DeLovely Farm, ASHA will have a booth at BreyerFest with information on our breed, including great new promotional materials developed by our Marketing Committee; what an exciting and unique opportunity to connect with over 5,000 visitors from around the country!

We intend to establish a presence for ASHA at Saddlebred shows as our resources permit; we're excited to have an ASHA booth at the Devon Show, and to be working with organizers regarding Saddlebred participation in this year's National Horse Show.

We now have an Amateur Owner-Trainer subcommittee; a new Audit Committee that is addressing recommendations from our outside auditors; and a special Task Force that is reviewing all ASHA publications. Our ASHA Planning Committee has an ambitious agenda, including formulation of proposed Bylaw modifications, development of various internal policies and procedures to recommend to the Board, and reconsideration of the ASHA's Mission Statement.

On Saturday July 16, the American Saddlebred Museum's Equine Art Auction will again be held at its Showplace for Saddlebreds at the Kentucky Horse Park, in Lexington, Kentucky. The auction will begin at 12 noon. Sixty-four lots of a variety of items will be sold during the early afternoon.

Offered in the 2012 auction are five original George Ford Morris works, six bronze sculptures, fourteen lots of historic books including an extremely rare "Black Beauty" illustrated by George Ford Morris, thirteen original works by contemporary artists, including a wonderful piece by Justin the Artistic Horse, three George Ford Morris posters or lithographs, five original works by noncurrent artists, four lots of antiques, four attractive and unusual collectibles, two lots of historic Saddlebred items, a vintage side saddle, an eight place setting of Hadley Blue Horse Pottery, and three non-bronze sculptures, including a spectacular life-size resin piece.

tion coordinator.

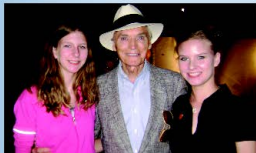

Drake, who was born in Shelby County, south of Indianapolis, began his professional career in Indiana, and in 1941 went to work for Howard Dickey in Detroit, Michigan. After serving in the Merchant Marines, Drake worked at Plainview Farms in Louisville, Kentucky, followed by three years at the Arthur Simmons Stables, where he worked ^{CI}Magnolia's Ann Rutledge, ^{CI}The Replica, and ^{CI}Blue Meadow Princess, each of which ultimately went on to become a World's Champion.

In 1956 Drake leased Timberland Farm at Racine, Wisconsin, which he operated as a public stable, before he and his wife, Candace, purchased Oakwood Farm at Hartland a year later, in 1957, which would become one of the largest stables in the Midwest, and from which came many top equitation and amateur riders. Particularly skilled in starting riders and matching them with horses, Drake developed, showed or trained such

campaigners as ^{CI}Sam McGee, Sensational Folly, Courageous Jean, King of Mystery, ^{CI}Regal Gold, The Firebird, and Pincroft Genius Maid.

After the sale of Oakwood Farm in 1976, he and his wife returned to Indiana. In 1990, the two were honored at the Wisconsin Futurity Horse Show as an example of how individuals can touch the lives of so many people, in so many different ways, all with a lasting impact, and the day was named "Ross Drake Stables Day."

Other of Mr. Drake's honors include being a 2005 inductee into the Indiana Horseman's Hall of Fame, a 2006 inductee into the UPHA Tom Moore Hall of Fame, and 2007 recipient of ASHA's Meritorious Service Award, which honors recipients for their contributions to ASHA on almost all levels over a long period of time.

Mr. Patrick was a renowned attorney in Anderson County for over 50 years, and served his country and community in numerous civic and legal capacities.

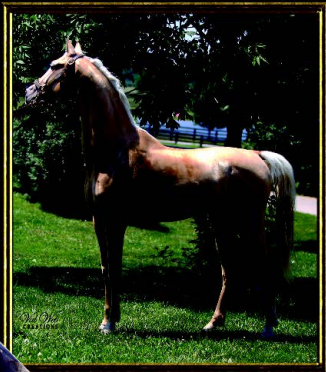

Lester Swaney

The Saddlebred world says goodbye to William Lester Swaney, 97, who passed away on March 25, 2012, at his home in Maryville, Missouri.

His start with Saddlebreds came in 1927 when at the age of 12 he went to work as a groom for J.H. "Jim" Tapp who was a well-known trainer at that time. Lester went on to become the manager/trainer for over 30 years of Faustiana Farms, Maryville, Missouri, owned by E.M. "Ferd" Townsend. Faustiana specialized in raising Saddlebreds with their foundation sire being Jack Dare's King's by King's Genius. For many years they were prominent in the futurities and in developing and showing young horses. Faustiana had such greats as Autumn Serenade, Supreme Moment, Dream Date, The Lark and Lady Babette.

Lester's best known horse was one he owned himself. He trained and showed his gelding as a junior gaited horse under the name of Bambino. When Lester sold him they changed his name to Oak Hill Chief. The rest is history as he won the World's Grand Championship three times, from 1943 to 1945.

Faustiana Farm later got into breeding and racing Standardbred horses. Lester continued as manager/trainer over that division, too. In 1958 Lester raced the pacer, McPhergus, to win more heats than any harness horse in America.

Lester was seriously injured and had to retire after a pacer fell with him in 1964. He then became a farm agent for 16 years with the Jackson Insurance Agency in Maryville. His body was willed to medical science so no service was held.

Remembering the "Greatest Name in Sales"

There was something about walking into that pavilion, the energy within it, even when the auctioneers were silent and no horses were trotting down the straightaway, the walls buzzed. The large black and white photographs of some of the Saddlebred world's greatest horses, the industry's best trainers leaning up against the rail nudging their clients to bid just a little bit higher. You never knew who you would see at Tattersalls, the usual suspects of course, but also a chance to see your dearest "horse show friends" between shows.

Anyone who has been to Tattersalls can think of at least a horse or two that stopped their conversations with their friends as it powered down the stretch hitting a big trot and filling the pavilion with an indescribable energy. The silence except for the pounding of the big-mov-

ing horse's hooffalls and the auctioneer's pleadings, continued until the bid spotters first "yeppppp!!!!!!" when everyone would begin to whisper and look, to see

who was bidding. Although Tattersalls is no longer, it is an American Saddlebred institution that will forever be remembered.

The history of Tattersalls stretches long before the Teaters, even long before its location in Lexington. Many probably do not realize that Lexington's Tattersalls survived numerous fires, nearly 20 owners; despite its success, it had a tumultuous history, but it still remained the Saddlebred industry's premier auction house.

The original Tattersalls still stands today in Newmarket, England, as the oldest Bloodstock Sales Company in the world—dating back to 1766. Horses

"My favorite memories are from when I first went in the early 60s and during the 70s. It was always so much fun, picturesque and exciting, and Meyer's was just a hop-skip away in downtown.

Does anyone remember the old man with the long mane of white hair and a tall walking staff? He was a sight and I'm not sure now if I ever did know why he was always there

or else I've just forgotten. Or seeing Cas Walker (Knoxville, Tennessee — grocery stores & his own local TV show — featured Dolly Parton in her very early years) strutting about and shouting out to different people in his gravelly East Tennessee twang.

And listening to the comments from leathery old trainers of 'nawww, he wangs' to 'lookce here now.' It was always colorful people & personalities as well as the horses, but foremost was all about looking for that good horse for a decent price and hoping you'd be lucky enough to have him turn out to be a majorly good'un that everyone else had passed on and missed. Or hoping one you were putting through would show well, bring a good price and go to a good owner who would appreciate & care for him/her.

My last Tattersalls was quite a while back in 2004. In many ways I wanted to, but didn't go to the last sale — it was mostly just too sad to know it would be gone (and then there was also an excellent case to be made for the fact I couldn't trust myself to not buy something I didn't have room for....). I know there are and will be other sales venues, but the 'feel' won't be there. And, apartments on that wonderful old site? Bleeceeech! That's almost obscene."

still go through that original pavilion, including some of the finest race horses in the world. As the demand for horses increased, Tattersalls decided to expand its operations to North America with William B. "Benny" Fasig leading the way. He established the American Tattersalls locations of Cleveland, New York, Chicago, and of course, Lexington.

1892, the Tattersalls-Fasig Company bought the Lexington Tattersalls site, adjacent to the Red Mile trotting track, which was developed in 1875. In 1893, the country went into recession, and the Tattersalls-Fasig Company was no longer. William Fasig then formed a partnership with E.A. Tipton to create Fasig-Tipton, another top Thoroughbred sales company of today. Tattersalls was purchased by Edward Courage, an Englishman who kept the Tattersalls name.

In 1897, Courage bought some adjacent property, then sold the entire package for \$20,000 to S.T. Harbison, A.H. Jewell, and J.W. Patterson, the Kentucky

Sales Company. Unfortunately on August 11, 1901, Tattersalls suffered its first fire, which destroyed the sales pavilion and the five original barns. Luckily all 165 horses stabled there

were spared. After the fire, the Kentucky Sales Company purchased three more acres and moved the auction house to a new barn. Just three years later, another fire, rumored to have been set by a 12-year-old boy, demolished the facilities. Tattersalls was again rebuilt.

During this time, horses were more of a necessity than a novelty item. At the turn of the century, there were four sales annually where Standardbreds and Saddlebreds were most popular, but the occasional Thoroughbred, Hackney, and jumper was also sprinkled in. During World War I, Tattersalls was integral to supplying horses to the French, British, and U.S. Governments. Dispersal Sales of American Saddlebreds at Tattersalls Lexington date back to 1909 when General John B. Castleman and his son

sold 75 Saddlebreds from their Shakertown, Kentucky Clifton Farm.

The following year, R.H. Boardman took a yearling colt sired by McDonald Chief to the sales pavilion. Boardman was not happy with his final bid, so he took the stud colt home, bringing him back to next year's sale. H.C. Barham purchased the colt, named Easter Cloud, that became the first Five-Gaited World's Grand Champion at the Kentucky State Fair. Easter Cloud claimed this title in 1917 with John T. Hook showing for Longview Farm.

The buildings were again destroyed by fire in 1913, the result of two young boys playing with matches. Partners Jewell and Patterson had had enough, and they sold out to Harbison.

When World War I broke out in Europe in 1914, the demand for horses skyrocketed. It was said that in just one battle in France, 5,000 horses were killed, and the soldiers needed new

mounts. Tattersalls rose to the occasion, supplying horses to the French and British armies and later to the U.S. Government, when America entered the war.

Harbison was not just a partner in ownership in Tattersalls, but a major Saddlebred owner. He even kept his sales horses at Tattersalls at all times. His trainer, Robert E. Moreland, trained numerous World's Champions, including 1918 Five-Gaited World's Grand Champion, Cascade, 1919 Five-Gaited World's Grand Champion, Liberty Girl, 1925 Three-Gaited World's Grand

Champion, Bohemian Actress, and 1927 Five-Gaited World's Grand Champion, Dark Rex. Harbison kept control of Tattersalls until he died in 1930. After his death, his estate continued to run the sales for two years until it was sold to W.J. Treacy and Ken Walker in 1933.

In 1933 the first record was set for

the highest price ever paid for a Saddlebred at public auction, when Robert E. Moreland put his breeding stallion, American Born through the July Sale. His entrance was embraced with wild applause, and when the gavel finally dropped it was for \$12,000 to Wm. M. Robinson of Nawbeck Farm in Paoli, Pennsylvania. Just a month later, American Born's daughter, Belle Le Rose (BHF) won the Five-Gaited World's Grand Championship, a title she repeated in 1934. He sired more world's grand champions, as well as six Hall of Fame Broodmares. American Born continued his reign, topping Jefferson Harris' sire rating in 1933, 1934, and 1936.

Although Lexington is the Horse Capitol of the World, there had not been a big show organization there for a long time. W. Jefferson Harris, a writer and professor at the University of Kentucky and an avid Saddlebred enthusiast, sought to change that. In conjunction with the Lexington Junior

League, the idea of a charity horse show in Lexington as a fund raiser was born. The project was surrounded by excitement, and The Red Mile was willing to hold the horse show in full cooperation. The Lexington Junior League Horse Show saw its debut in the summer of 1937.

The show became a huge success and attracted a great amount of out-of-town

horsemen, prompting the inclusion of a Tattersalls Summer Sale. The tradition of the Lexington Junior Horse Show paired with the Tattersalls Summer Sale continued until the last Summer Sale was held in 2006. According to Ed and Susie Teater, the sale was forced to end its summer sale because it was just too hot in the pavilion.

of Tattersalls in T.A. Duke. In the 40's, Maryland Farm of Brentwood, Tennessee, the home of top sire, American Ace, set the precedent for production sales. Spindletop Farm, Leatherwood Farm, Ridgfield's Farm, and Reverie Knoll followed suit helping Tattersalls prosper through the hard times of World War II.

In 1948, Tattersalls switched hands

yet again when R.S. Eddy, Jr. and F.H. Eddy of New Orleans purchased the auction house. The Eddys were no strangers to owning equine companies, as they owned the Fairgrounds and Jefferson Park Race Tracks in New Orleans and Fairmount Track near St. Louis. In addition to their vested interests in Thoroughbreds, they were also avid Saddlebred exhibitors, showing their string under the direction of Johnny Northcutt. The star of their show string was Stonewall Supreme. The Eddys made vast renovations to the sales company and were the first to accept personal checks for the payment of horses. The acceptance of personal checks came in 1950. Before personal checks were accepted, horses had to be paid for by cashier's checks or cash. One of the first checks accepted at Tattersalls was from Alvin Ruxer for Judy O'Lee (BHF). She went on to become the foundation mare for Ruxer Farms.

In 1954, Tattersalls came under the ownership of the famous Dodge Stables and Castleton Farm owner Frederick Van Lennep, along with other Lexington horsemen for the reported price of \$365,000. The syndicate later merged with the Lexington Trots

Remembering Tattersalls

Kristy Leech

"My fondest memory of Tattersalls actually doesn't involve a purebred Saddlebred. I think it was in 1974, there was a Buckskin horse and a Palomino horse going through the sale. I was 10 years old and fell head-over-heels in love with the Buckskin that was listed as being a 10-year-old Half-Saddlebred. He had the dumbest name, Buckeroo.

One of our customers, D.A. Boyd bought the Palomino for his daughter, Joanne, to ride around their farm. He paid \$300 for him.

I begged my dad, Billy Cox, for the Buckskin. He told me he would buy him, but not if he brought more than the Palomino. I camped out by the horse's stall for what seemed like an eternity.

I panicked when my parents went to Roger's for lunch and refused to go with them for fear the horse would go through the sale while they were gone. (Not that anyone would allow a 10-year-old to bid on a horse!)

When the horse went through, I was giving death stares at anyone bidding on him. There was a man steadily bidding against my dad. When the

horse went over \$300 my dad stopped bidding. I tried so hard not to cry, I fully understood a deal was a deal, but I couldn't help it. Mr. Boyd went over to my dad and handed him \$100 and told him to please buy the horse for me. In the meantime, I stepped up my death stare at the man bidding against my dad. I got the horse for a final bid of \$425, and I was the happiest kid in the world!

I renamed him Huggie Bear, Hugo for short. I showed him in any and every show I could show him in. He went to Dixie Jubilee one year and won the Open to any Breed class, beating some pretty nice horses.

It rarely snows in Alabama, but when it did, my dad made a makeshift sled out of a stall door and Hugo took us all over the pasture with it in tow.

Throughout his show career, my parents turned down WAY more money than they paid for Hugo. He was my best friend though, and he wasn't going anywhere.

Hugo passed away in 2002, he and I were 38 years old when he died. He is buried on my farm wearing the leather halter I bought him at Fennell's with his name on it back in 1974."

Remembering Tattersalls

"Approximately in late 40s — early 50s, I never missed a Tattersalls sale. One of my most vivid memories was sitting in the

'old' Tattersalls, on bleachers full of splinters, with my great friend — Royce Cates. Royce wore bib overalls and old dirty boots — a grand and wise horse-man who was a friend to everyone. He bought and sold horses every day — we traded often. Royce and wife, Alice moved to California from the hills of Tennessee — Alice was very much a

student of the Saddlebred. They are the parents of one of today's leading horse-men—Randy Cates. Royce was instrumental in introducing dozens of Hollywood stars to the Saddlebred industry. Barbara Mandrell, William Shatner, Sylvester Stallone, Patrick Duffy and many other celebrities hung on every word Royce shared.

I became President of ASHA in 1980, and I was asked by ASHA to go to California and present an award to Barbara Mandrell — On my arrival, I expected to see my same old friend with bib overalls. Instead a transformed Royce greeted me with alligator boots with sterling tips, tailored trousers with engraved belt and silver buckle, silk shirt with silver tips on the collars and every Hollywood Star following him like the Pied Piper.

During that trip, Royce said "There is another new person coming on the Saddlebred scene that will need to be recognized," that was William Shatner who has become a good personal friend who I have trained and shown colts for on occasion."

Breeders Association, The Red Mile's parent company.

After a fire dry spell, flames struck the sales company again on October 27, 1956, destroying the pavilion and an adjacent barn. Rebuilding began immediately, and in 1957, the 1,100 seat sales pavilion, offices, and adjoining 60-stall concrete and steel barn that kept the sales running through the end were completed. The seats in the pavilion came from the old Crosley Baseball Field in Cincinnati. They were even marked with the Cincinnati Reds logo on the sides.

The Vanderburgh and Warrick County American Saddlebred Breeders 4-H Clubs in Indiana and the Washington County Club in Kentucky came to Tattersalls in 1958. Tattersalls did not charge commission to the 4-H'ers, and the Lexington Junior League Horse Show allowed an exhibition of the colts at the show before the sale. The 4-H sale was incredibly successful as it benefited the 4-H'ers, the Saddlebred industry, and drew more people to the sales. Some of the 4-H yearlings went on to become big time

show horses, such as ^{CH}Duke Of Daylight, the 1966 and 1967 Fine Harness World's Grand Champion.

Records were set at the Spring Sale of 1966, which hosted the dispersal of Senator T. N. Wood's Brynfan Tyddyn Stables. Indiana

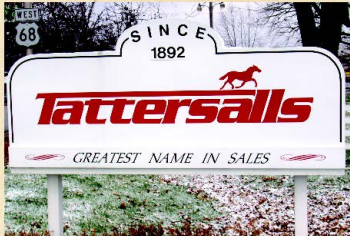

Peavine and his daughter ^{CL}Lily Merrill, who had won the Junior Five-Gaited World's Championship the previous year, both sold for \$45,000. Lily's dam, Ensign's Fair Virginia (BHF) found the gavel dropping on \$16,000—the highest price an American Saddlebred broodmare

had ever brought at public auction. The 21 horses in the dispersal sold for \$170,000, an average price of \$8,095!

The sale continued to gain steam and produce quality breeding and show stock—continuing to produce numerous world's champions. The July 1975 sale was one of the best ever. There, over 70 Dodge Stables horses sold, brining an average of \$6,615.

Teater Sales Enterprises, Inc. (TSE) was formed in 1986 to manage Saddlebred auctions. Ed recalled how he came to manage Tattersalls along with his

family, "Mr. Van Lennep came to me. I had worked for Dodge Stables, Mr. Van Lennep was the owner of Dodge Stables and Castleton Farm, my father worked there 30 some years, I worked there 15 years from about '55, after I got out of the service. I then worked for Rock Creek for about six years, and then went back to Dodge Stables. When Dodge Stables closed, they sold all the horses through Tattersalls. I went to North Ridge at that time, when I got back here around '85, Mr. Van Lennep wanted me to run Tattersalls, I talked to my brother Lou, and I just wasn't interested in working for somebody again...so we decided to rent it and set up TSE Tattersalls, and he gave us an exclusive on all Saddlebred sales."

They conducted three sales annually at the Lexington Tattersalls, led by Ed Teater and his late brother Louis Teater. It was a family operation through and through as Lou and Ed managed the sale and their wives, Mary Ann and Suzie prepared the catalogs and handled the office. Ed's son Martin, also a Saddlebred trainer, was in charge of the

stabling. Ed's daughters Dee Teater and Whitney Reynolds also worked the sales. In recent years, his youngest son, Ryan read pedigrees in the announcer's stand. Martin's daughter, Cassidy and Ryan's long-time girlfriend, Sarah Crane would run tickets.

Putting together the catalog — the red and white book that will forever be engrained in the minds of Saddlebred lovers everywhere — proved to be difficult, Ed explained.

"Everyone talks about spots where their horse is. They want it at 12:58, that's when it sells for the most money! As a sales manager, you have to put the horses where you think they will sell the

best, you have to pretty well stick to that, give yourself a good distribution. Take that mediocre/bad horse in the light part of the sale and he will bring twice as much as he would in the middle of the good horses."

Ed joked about how one of his favorite memories from the sale is about "the spot," and the only time he

ever made money on a bet.

"This boy rode a three-gaited horse and Suzie put him on the first day, he

had a picture and everything, didn't look too bad. He and his wife came to see me, and he was mad! He said, 'You've got me in a bad, bad spot, she won't sell.' I said how much money do you want for this mare, and he said \$5,000. So I said I'll bet you \$100 she'll sell for \$5,000. And let me tell you this boy was so tight, his shoes squeaked when he walked. The mare brought \$5,100. He had been pretty tough on me, and he came walking into the office after the sale, and I said well we've got your horse sold. He reached back and pulled out his wallet and oh boy it was

Remembering Tattersalls

"My first sale was probably in 1974 when I was eleven. I remember looking through the spaces between the fence in the turnaround and developing a friendship as the years passed, with the master of all bid spotters, "Count." I didn't know until years later that his real name was Paul Holler.

I never missed a sale and thought the greatest thing to do was to sit on the wall adjacent to the steps opposite the auctioneer's stand. For some reason it felt like a rite of passage to sit on the wall. I watched Dudley Abbott with his ever-present cigar while he ran the sale and socialized with everyone.

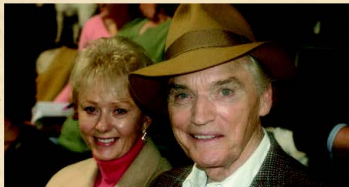
I watched the horses carefully to hone my skills on their desirable and undesirable traits, and all the while learning about the value of horses. I dreamed of riding and owning one of those fancy show horses someday, and I really wanted one of those curb bit necklaces that Candie Abbott had for sale stowed away in her purse.

I got engaged during Tattersalls. My boyfriend at the time, now my husband, showed up at my house with a ring as I was getting ready to head to Tattersalls. He should have run while he had the chance. I don't think that he realized that the horses and everything Saddlebred came with me."

hard for him. He handed it over, and I wasn't going to keep it, but man he was mean to me, so I put it in my pocket."

Under the TSE banner, huge auction records were set in the Saddlebred industry. The Teaters handled sales for many of the top owners and farms in the Saddlebred industry.

These big sales really helped the industry. Ed observed, "The general market, buyers saw that if you want a real nice horse, you've got to pull out your pocketbook out and pay. I've always said a good horse should bring good money, because there's not very many of

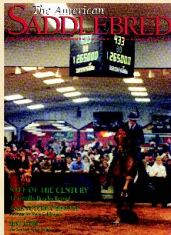

them. We were fortunate that a lot of those horses went on to be champions."

In 1995, 475 horses went through the Fall Sale, with three select consignments, including the dispersal of Redd Crabtree's bloodstock, the Elisabeth Goth/Bettina Bancroft reduction sale, and of course the Callaway Hills production sale. During this sale, Callaway's Forecaster brought what was then the highest price ever for an American Saddlebred at public auction. The three-year-old five-gaited gelding by Callaway's Blue Norther and out of Callaway's Country Gal brought \$275,000 from Lynn and Peter Via's Fox Grape Farm. Forecaster was the 2003 Five-Gaited World's Grand Champion with amateur Nancy Leigh Fisher.

Cameo's Angel Wings, the 1990 Three-Gaited World's Grand Champion, became the highest priced broodmare ever through public auction, also at the 1995 Fall Sale. She went for \$68,000 in foal to Salemtown. Consigned by Elisabeth Goth, she found a new owner in Kohler Farm.

The record for the highest overall average was reset at \$8,563, up 9.68% from the 1995 Fall Sale. The 1997 Callaway Hills' consignment sale, held during the Fall Sale, brought \$1,767,700 for 57 head in a record-breaking single session. The session was so successful, in

fact, that the Callaway Hills' session averaged \$31,012 per horse!

Callaway's Hakuna Matata brought \$360,000 to become the sales topper. Just as the Vias did in 1995, they set another record by buying Hakuna Matata, a two-year-old five-gaited gelding. At this record-setting sale, Fox Grape Farm also purchased Callaway's Hot Pepper for \$200,000. The purchase of Hakuna Matata and Hot Pepper staked the claim for the Vias to dominate the three-year-old five-gaited division the following year. Hakuna Matata was crowned the Five-Gaited Three-Year-Old Stallion/Gelding

Remembering Tattersalls

"Many years ago, the great horseman Tom Moore was riding a sensational five-gaited gelding through the Tattersalls sale. Don't remember the horse's name but I believe it began with Bo or Beau.

My memory is vivid of Moore laying the reins down on the horse's neck and racking him without any direction from human hands.

This got the crowd buzzing, as most people had never seen anything like it.

I recall the horse set a record for the highest price up to that time for an American Saddlebred through the Tattersalls sales."

World's Champion, and Hot Pepper was the Five-Gaited Three-Year-Old Mare World's Champion.

The horse that really stands out in Ed's mind as one of his favorites that went through the sale was ^{CI}Callaway's Copyright. Of the grand gelding, Ed remembers, "I saw him work about five times, we saw him show at Louisville. He was one of the first horses that sold for \$250,000. When you sell a horse for over \$200,000 at the sale, you feel pretty good about it."

Copyright went on to break records by winning the Fine Harness World's Grand Championship six years in a row with John T. Jones for Fox Grape Farms after winning the Three-Year-Old Stallion/Gelding Fine Harness Stake with Larry Hodge, and the Junior Fine Harness Stake in 2000 with Jones.

The Teaters led a first class sale all the way through until their last sale, the Fall 2011 Sale. 358 horses went through the final sale, and a packed house filled the pavilion during that sale for the final Callaway Hills consignment, which included 33 horses. After the last horse left the straightaway on the final day of

the sale, people ran to collect any treasure they could get their hands on from the Saddlebred industry's most famous and storied auction house.

While not the best showing of respect for Tattersalls, it said a great deal about how much people want to hold onto the history of the venue that is no longer.

Jimmy and Helen Robertson of Robertson Equine Sales and James and Jackie Hale of Southern Saddlebred Sales have created new spring and fall sales to try to fill the void of the industry's greatest sales. Ed Teater offered some words of wisdom for the Robertsons and the Hales, "They're just going to have to feel their way through. There will be some good years, some mediocre years, and some years that aren't good. It will take some time to build your client base up. Every person

that runs a sale has a little bit different idea of how to run a sale, if their way works out they hit a homerun."

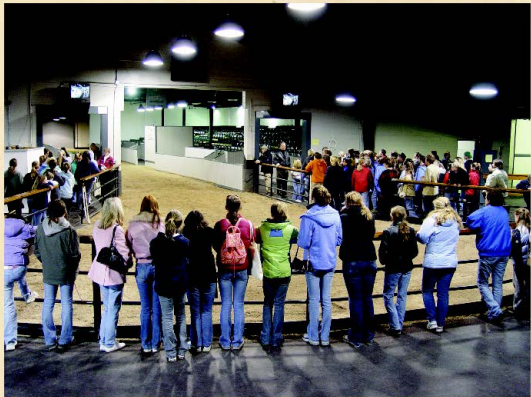
Ed and Suzie Teater have some extra time on their hands now that the sales are over. They both joked about how they're noticing things to be fixed around the house that they did not notice before. And while the extra time is refreshing, it was clear that they will always look back on the sales with great fondness.

"It was really fun. The most fun part was the sales themselves. Name Reservation Form: Use to reserve names. **Saddlebred Record Rules & Application Form:** Use to apply to the Saddlebred Record program.

Saddlebred Select Rules & Application Form: Use to apply to the Saddlebred Select achievement program.

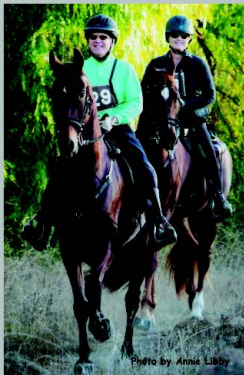

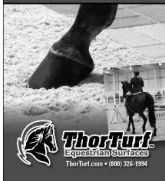

The grace period deadline for ASR Kentucky, Kentucky Amateur and National Three-Year-Old Futurity weanling payments will be the Kentucky State Fair first entry closing date.

Futurity foal application for registration deadlines:

Due to the extremely high number of futurity foal applications received in previous years either the day before or the actual date when a conditional registration number is required to be eligible to show, foals showing in the Kentucky & Kentucky Amateur Futurity Weanling Divisions must have applications for registration received in the American Saddlebred Registry office by the Kentucky State Fair first entry closing date, or, in the event this date falls on a Saturday or Sunday, by 4:30 p.m. Eastern Time on the following business day.

NO EXCEPTIONS. A rush fee of \$50 will be assessed for any such applications received after the Kentucky State Fair first entry closing date. Such fee will be billed to the applicant and will be due and payable immediately.

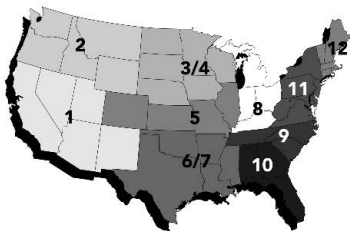
