BADGES

The ASIYP Badge program is offered for use by individuals and groups for a more in depth study of certain aspects of riding, horse care and history.

You do not have to be enrolled in the ASIYP Levels to apply for badges. These badges can be especially useful for clubs or camps to use for riders to earn as a group. The badges are approximately two-inch (2") embroidered patches in bright colors and unique designs, suitable for attaching to a jacket or sweatshirt.

LETTER

The ASIYP Letter program is now available. This Letter can be earned by completing all three ASIYP Levels, plus a list of other requirements. Riders completing all requirements will receive a custom designed chenille Letter and special recognition.

ASIYP COMPETITIONS

ASIYP Competitions
will be open to any youth
currently enrolled in ASIYP, all
ASHA Junior members, and any
member of an ASHA Youth Club (ASHAYC). The competitions will be conducted in two main categories –
Activity Division and Horsemanship Division.

Activity Division

The Activity Division consists of several events which will be conducted via mail. Tentative events for this division include: Photography contest; Art contest; Story contest; Video contest; Computer Art contest.

Horsemanship Division

The Horsemanship Division consists of six specific events: Showmanship At Halter; Horsemanship; Pattern Riding; Written Test; Judging Classes; Hippology Test.



The Horsemanship events are to be conducted as follows: Each contestant is required to compete in all six events and will receive a numerical score plus award ribbons through sixth place in each event. At the conclusion of the six events, each contestant's score will be totaled. The top ten contestants, based on their total scores, will receive "Top Ten" ribbons. The two highest scoring contestants will be crowned the ASIYP Champion and Reserve Champion and may receive monetary or other valuable prizes.

You are not required to own a horse to compete in this division, but you will need the USE of an American Saddlebred. This division is open to youth who ride any discipline (Saddle Seat, Hunt Seat, Western, Dressage) and, because of its "knowledge" classes, offers an equal opportunity to youth of various riding skill levels.

We encourage ASHAYCs, ASHA Charter Clubs, etc. to hold Horsemanship Competitions in their area. They may be held in conjunction with an existing show, Academy show, other event, or as their own special event.

The American Saddlebred International Youth Program (ASIYP) is a multilevel program open to any youth 21 years of age and under. It makes no dif-

ference where you live as the program is open to youth anywhere in the world.

This brochure will provide you with an outline of what ASIYP has to offer. The educational material included with the various ASIYP Levels has been selected and designed to provide you with general information and interesting and important facts about horses of all

breeds. You will learn about the origin and history of the horse and its importance to man through the years, its uses in the past as well as present, its health and proper care, and much more. As you work your way into the upper levels of the program, you will learn about the American Saddlebred horse in particular.

You are not required to own a horse to participate in ASIYP! If you have never been near a horse, the written materials will give you a head start for the day when you eventually do get to ride. If you already ride, the program will provide you with knowledge that will help you improve your horsemanship and horse management skills. As you satisfactorily complete the various Levels, you will earn certificates and be eligible for special seals.

To get the most from your ASIYP experience, you might wish to join your local American Saddlebred Charter Club or an ASHA Youth Club in your area and enjoy completing the requirements with friends.

This brochure tells about the various Levels and special programs, their requirements and awards. LEVEL I - GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

Upon satisfactorily answering the questions, you will receive a Certificate and a Chevron. Specific rules will be included with the material. Answer 100% correct and you will receive a special seal for your Certificate (also offered in Levels II and III). A CHWing Commander seal can be earned by properly completing these requirements: groom a horse; prepare two feedings; clean a stall; assist in trimming; care for tack (saddle, bridle); cool out; photograph; bandage; measure and lead a horse properly.

The ^{CH}My-My seal can be earned by performing the following: pick up and hold reins correctly; ride properly at a walk, trot and canter; be able to back your horse; perform a figure eight and a serpentine at a trot and canter, and identify the part of a saddle and bridle.
