The American Saddlebred Horse Association honors its outstanding members each year at the Annual Meeting in February with its most prestigious awards. Award winners receive a custom-crafted julep cup, which is symbolic of the highest honor ASHA can bestow upon an individual, while Wing Commander Medal recipients each receive a medallion.

Members are encouraged to nominate individuals for these honors. Nominations must be submitted in writing, accompanied by a short biography of the nominee and the reason as to why the person or family should receive that specific award. The Board of Directors reviews the nominations and selects a winner.

HORSE OF THE YEAR

Beginning in the 2005 competition year, ASHA began designating its Horse of the Year, in order to nominate the outstanding performance horse of that year to the United States Equestrian Federation for consideration in its membership voting for the USEF's overall Horse of the Year from all competing breeds and disciplines.

The American Saddlebred Horse of the Year is chosen by the officers of the American Saddle bred Horse Association, based on consideration of all performances throughout the competition year at major events, with an emphasis on the World's Championship Horse Show at the Kentucky State Fair (Louisville),

the UPHA National Championship at the American Royal (Kansas City, Missouri), the Lexington Jr. League Horse Show (Kentucky), and overall competition records submitted by all registered shows.

FRANK OGLETREE YOUTH AWARD

The Frank Ogletree Youth Award was established to honor the late James Frank Ogletree Jr.

Ogletree was an attorney who unselfishly gave his time and talents as an ASHA Director. He was especially interested in young people and encouraged their involvement with American Saddlebred horses up until his death in 1985. He owned and operated Mark Hall Farms in Greenville, South Carolina, the home of several World's Champions.

The winner of the Frank Ogletree Youth Award should exhibit superior sportsmanship throughout his or her show career.

Nominees must be ASHA Junior Members who demonstrated participation and achievement within the show ring, exhibited positive personal characteristics and true sportsmanship, as well as served as a true role model for their peers. In addition to receiving a julep cup, winners also receive a life membership to ASHA.

C. J. CRONAN SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

C. J. Cronan was a longtime secretary of ASHA and many people considered him "Mr. Saddlebred." Cronan created the first American Saddlebred futurity program in 1927 at the Kentucky State Fair, which is now known as the Kentucky Futurity. Cronan's futurity model is the foundation for more than 50 American Saddlebred futurity programs across the country. As a true equine lover, Cronan was known to have said, "Horses do more for people, than people do for horses." Cronan passed away in 1985.

GORDON JENKINS INTERNATIONAL AWARD

Gordon Jenkins attended the first production sale at Sutton Farm in Australia in the 1960s. The owners of Sutton Farm were the first to bring American Saddlebred horses to Australia. Jenkins, from Canyonleigh, Australia, fell in love with the new breed. By 1978, Jenkins began breeding American Saddlebreds and he and his wife, Betty, owned the largest American Saddlebred horse farm in Australia.

The American Saddlebred Horse Association of Australia was formed in 1977. Jenkins served as president from 1983 to 1988, and then served as vice president until his death in 1990. The Gordon Jenkins International Award was designed to honor a person who has gone the extra mile to introduce and promote the

American Saddlebred horse to other countries. In 1993, Betty Jenkins, Gordon Jenkins' wife was the first recipient of the Gordon Jenkins International Award.

BREEDERS HALL OF FAME

The Breeders Hall of Fame was formed in 2006 to include each previous winner of the former Breeders Award. A new class will be inducted each year. The Breeders Hall of Fame honors a breeder who over a lifetime has shown or proven serious interest in betterment for the breed; consistently shown improvement and eagerness to learn; exhibited good sportsmanship and good horsemanship; demonstrated long-term interest; had success with more than one horse; has reached a pinnacle of success; and has unselfishly given to others, and encouraged other breeders, in an effort to better the breed.

Lurline Roth was an ASHA Director and one of the great exhibitors in the horse show game. She is remembered as the owner of CHChief Of Longview and CHSweetheart On Parade. However, even after these greats, she continued showing for many years. Roth's sportsmanship was evident, as she was gracious in victory or defeat. She was the California Vice President of ASHA in 1931. She passed away in 1985.
