February 2, 2018

President, Donna Pettry-Smith introduced Lori Nelson from USEF. Lori Nelson explained some of the new rules being put in place for 2018. Most were clarifications of existing rules. She also clarified the rule change process.

The ASHA 2017 year in review video was shown. This chronicled the shows and fund raisers from the past year. After the year in review video Alan Bosworth showed an ASHA Marketing video showing the athleticism of the American Saddlebred across several different disciplines. He then shared with us the findings of the University of Louisville's economic impact study.

The Nominating Committee shall consist of five members, two of whom shall be elected by the members of the ASHA at the annual meeting of the ASHA, two of whom shall be selected by the Board of Directors at its board meeting immediately following the annual meeting of the ASHA, and the remaining member who shall be appointed by the President as the Chair of the Nominating Committee. The members of the Nominating Committee for Directors shall serve until the next annual meeting. Any vacancies in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

Four names were nominated from the floor, R.H. Bennett, Betsy Boone, Charlotte Kurtz, and Judy Werner. A motion was made and seconded to close the nominations. After paper ballot voting Betsy Boone and Judy Werner were chosen to be on the Nominating Committee.

David Mount ASHA Treasurer gave us the Financial Report. Our 2016 audit report came back clean, with a favorable report. Our financial statements were presented fairly and met with generally accepted accounting practices . Strothman and Co. did a review of the ASHA election for the Board of Directors. A small amount of votes were not accepted because of irregularities but the election report came back as acceptable and fairly done. Out investment policy was updated . Raymond James was selected as our investment banker and is being used by both ASHA and ASR. Raymond James has consolidated and rebalanced our investments per our investment policy statement . The financial committee of ASHA has instituted a budget policy statement. We also have updated our accounting software. This will improve our reporting and make daily tasks easier with less data entry .

ASHA had two fund raisers in 2017 . One was the Triple Crown Challenge held at The Lexington Junior League Horse Show. This raised \$41,782.00 The Stallion Sweeps raised \$41,380.00 in 2017 .

Our Financials for 2017 show we have net earnings of \$ 120,525.00. This put us \$8,000.00 ahead of our budget. The proposed budget for 2018 shows net earnings of \$54,000.00. We will have two significant expenses in 2018, the Media plan and new work stations. Goals for 2018 are to continue putting in place policies and procedures, also an updated management services agreement between ASHA and ASR, and continue our focus on revenue and expenses .

Registrar Lisa Duncan gave her Registry Report.

Registrations completed for 2017 1,527

Registrations completed for 2016 1,316

This gave us an increase of 211 or an increase of 14 %

Transfers completed for 2017 were 2731

Transfers completed for 2016 were 2795

This gave us a decrease of 64 or a 2% decrease
