allaway's Summer Rain was bred by Callaway Hills Stable, Jefferson City, Missouri. Foaled in 1993, she was never shown and entered the broodmare ranks at an early age, with her first foal being born in 1998. She has been owned by some of the breeders in the industry including Callaway Hills, Virgil and Sandra Helm, Mike Bulleigh, and Fox Grape Farms, Inc., before ending up with her current owners Steve and Tiffany Wheeler of Autumn Hills Farm LLC.

The first of her offspring to earn her a qualification for entry to the Broodmare Hall of Fame was her third foal Sonoran Select (by Desert's Supreme Memories). He was the 2004 Three-Year-Old Five-Gaited Stallion/Gelding Reserve World's Champion. In 2010, his full brother, What About Phil, earned her second qualification when he became Reserve World's Champion Five-Gaited Show Pleasure Adult Division II. Coincidentally, Autumn Hills LLC had purchased Callaway's Summer Rain the year before and they trained What About Phil to his reserve world's championship title for their client, his owner Sarah Crane.

Callaway's Summer Rain still needed one of her offspring to win a world's championship to become a Hall of Fame broodmare. Though the cross of WGC sire WC Desert's Supreme Memories with Callaway's Summer Rain had certainly proved successful, the Wheelers chose to try Callaway's Summer Rain with WCC sire Samur in 2015. That 2016 foal, Just Can't Get Enough, debuted at Louisville for her owners/breeders to be crowned the 2018 Two-Year-Old Three-Gaited Division II World's Champion. He is her last registered foal on record.

Callaway's Summer Rain is by WGC sire WC Callaway's Blue Norther, sire of Five-Gaited WGC <sup>CH</sup>Callaway's Forecaster, WCC sire WCC

<sup>CH</sup>Callaway's Born To Win, WCC Callaway's No More Mr. Nice Guy, WCC Callaway's Sweet Thing, WCC <sup>CH</sup>Callaway's Cumulus, etc. Broodmares by Callaway's Blue Norther have produced Three-Gaited WGC <sup>CH</sup>Real Action, WCC <sup>CH</sup>Soquili's Curious George, WC sire WC A Rare Temper, and many more. She is line bred to multiple WGC <sup>CH</sup>Wing Commander as she traces to him once through her sire line and an astonishing three times through her dam line. Many breeders believe the only way to establish type is through linebreeding, and it certainly seems to have worked for Callaway's Summer Rain.

She is out of a daughter of WGC sire WCC Harlem Globetrotter and her second dam, Fascinatin' Magic, is by WC sire Mr. Magic Man, giving her two top broodmare sires on her dam side. Second dam Fascinatin' Magic is a half sister to WC Sultan's Sweet Lorraine (dam of RWC Captron) and to Samantha Supreme (dam of WC Main Street U.S.A., RWC <sup>CH</sup>Lady Samantha, WC sire Steal My Heart, She's Superb (BHF), etc., and second dam of WCC <sup>CH</sup>Madame Machine, WC Strapless, and RWC I'm Bewitched), etc.

Her third dam, Suzi O'Lee, is a half sister to four famous Hall of Fame broodmares; Melody O'Lee, Jasper Sweetheart, Ann O'Lee and Jasper Lady Evelyn, as well as to Molly O'Lee (dam of WC sire Mr. Magic Man, Jasper Lou (BHF), RWC O'Lee!! O'Lee!! and WC sire Jay O'Lee and second dam of WC CHSupreme Quality, WC The Executor, WC <sup>CH</sup>Welcome

Back, WC Caraway (BHF), and world's champion producer Lady Talmage). Her fourth dam, Judy O'Lee, is by the prominent sire Leatherwood King and was the foundation mare of Ruxer Farms. You would be hard pressed to find a stronger female line in the third and fourth generations on any set of papers.

Seven Hall of Fame broodmares appear on her four generation set of papers, including noted matron Fine Harness WGC <sup>CH</sup>Kate Shriver on the top side and the famous Fine Harness WGC <sup>CH</sup>Supreme Airs on the bottom. Callaway's Summer Rain is a mare with no show record, yet the genes to produce champions were present. If the bloodlines are

there, the show ring success will follow, whether it is in the first or the second generation. On paper, this mare was bred to be a good producer and the proof is in the pudding as she has now produced three offspring that have won world's championships or reserve world's championships in three divisions at the Kentucky State Fair World's Championship Horse Show.
