RECORDING OF HORSE SHOWS, WCHS POINTS AND AWARDS




ASHBA provides a variety of services to horse shows that includes recording of horse shows, results, high point awards, and the qualification system for the World's Championship Horse Show. Horse Show across the United States are eligible to be recorded by ASHBA by completing the ASHBA Horse Show Application, submitting a copy of their prize list, certificate of liability insurance, and paying the \$50 application fee. Once a show is recorded by ASHBA, results are submitted and posted on our website. Results are then translated to points for our High Point Awards program and used to determine eligibility for the World's Championship Horse Show.

HORSE SHOW GRANTS

ASHBA Horse Show Grants are available for financially challenged American Saddlebred competitions. The program is funded through the support of generous sponsors, as well as through horse show application fees. Grants are available to shows on an annual basis with a maximum grant amount of \$5,000 per show in a calendar year. To date, ASHBA has awarded nearly \$35,000 to horse shows across the United States.

Shows can only use grant money for officials, insurance, facility rentals, media, promotion, medical personnel, vets, farriers and natural disasters. The money cannot be used for hospitality, decorations, memberships, charitable donations, fines, fees or any other non-essential expenses.

SHARE THE SADDLEBRED GRANTS



The ASHBA #SharetheSaddlebred Grant was established to help support members, charter clubs and youth clubs with breed promotion. The Grant helps make promotional and demonstration opportunities possible by awarding recipients with financial assistance to travel, attend and participate in events that promote the American Saddlebred.

Applications must be submitted at least 30 days before the event is set to take place. A person, or group, will only be eligible for one grant per year.

HORSING AROUND WITH ELLEN BEARD





NATIONAL SELECT SERIES

The ASHBA National Select Series, presented by State Line Tack, was created to encourage more people to show American Saddlebreds, Half Saddlebreds, Hackney Ponies and Road Horses. The Series strengthens the show horse market by adding value to the competitive experience, while promoting a market for horses that are not currently competing at the World's Championship Horse Show.

Shows can offer any of the 18 standalone qualifying classes for American Saddlebreds and Half Saddlebreds, Hackney Ponies, and Roadsters. Shows that are interested in hosting National Select Series qualifying classes must notify the ASHBA office at least 30 days prior to the competition in order to get ribbons in time for the competition.
